



Watch for turning cars.

Even when you have the walk signal, watch for turning cars — drivers may not see you.

More than 75 people are hit each year in the Triangle by cars turning at intersections.

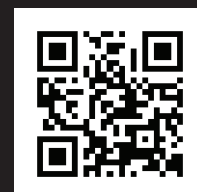




Cross safely when you exit the bus.

Pay attention in parking lots.

When walking in a parking lot,
watch for cars — drivers may
not see you.

More than 100 people are hit by cars
each year in parking lots around the Triangle.
